Second Public Hearing Scheduled for Solar Facilities Proposed to be Sited in Wicomico County

(BALTIMORE, MD) – Local residents and other interested members of the public are again invited to comment on a proposal by Wicomico Wilber Solar 1, LLC, Wicomico Wilber Solar 2, LLC and Wicomico Wilber Solar 3, LLC to construct three co-located solar generating facilities totaling 15 MW in Wicomico County. The hearing will take place on **Wednesday, August 13, 2025 at 6:30 p.m.** at the Hampton Inn (Choptank Conference Room), 121 E. Naylor Mill Road in Salisbury. The first public hearing in this case took place on May 5, 2025.

In December 2024, the developer applied to the Maryland Public Service Commission for what is known as a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN), which grants an applicant the authority to construct an energy generating station in Maryland. According to the application, the developer proposes to build the projects, intended as part of Maryland’s community solar program, on approximately 78 acres of an industrially-zoned property at 335 Hampshire Road in Salisbury.

In addition to taking comments from the public, the hearing will include a presentation by the applicant, and brief statements by the parties, including the Power Plant Research Program of the Maryland Department of Natural Resources and the Commission’s Technical Staff, as to their recommendations in the case.
