Virtual Public Hearing Set for Solar Facilities Proposed to be Sited in Somerset County

(BALTIMORE, MD) – Local residents and other interested members of the public are invited to comment on proposals by TPE MD SO19, LLC and TPE MD SO201, LLC to construct two separate, co-located 5.0 MW solar generating facilities in Somerset County. A virtual hearing on both projects will take place on **Monday, July 7, 2025 at 6:30 p.m.** before Public Utility Law Judge Jennifer J. Grace.

In February 2025, TPE MD SO19 and TPE MD SO201 applied to the Maryland Public Service Commission for what is known as a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN), which grants an applicant the authority to construct an energy generating station in Maryland. According to the application, the developer proposes to build the SO19 project on approximately 38.5 acres of a nearly 44-acre property at the intersection of Holland Crossing Road and Crisfield Marion Road in Crisfield; the SO201 project would be built directly across Holland Crossing Road to the north on 38 acres of a 46-acre site.

In addition to taking comments from the public, the hearing will include a presentation by the applicant, brief statements by the parties, including the Power Plant Research Program of the Maryland Department of Natural Resources, and the Commission's Technical Staff, as to their respective roles in the case.
