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NOTICE OF INTERVENTION DEADLINE AND REQUEST FOR COMPLETENESS DETERMINATION

On June 26, 2026,¹ Baltimore Gas and Electric Company (“BGE” or the “Applicant”) filed an application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (“CPCN”) requesting authorization to construct the Maryland Line to High Ridge Project (the “Project”). The Project consists of constructing approximately 59 miles of new 500 kV overhead transmission line from the Maryland state line in Harford County through Baltimore County to BGE's High Ridge Substation in Howard County and rebuilding approximately 55 miles of existing transmission circuits within BGE's existing transmission line rights-of-way to accommodate the new circuit. The Project was directed by PJM Interconnection, L.L.C. as part of the regional transmission planning process.

Petitions to intervene in the matter must be filed with the Commission's Executive Secretary, Andrew S. Johnston, Maryland Public Service Commission, William Donald Schaefer

Tower, 16th Floor, 6 St. Paul Street, Baltimore, Maryland 21202, by **Monday, July 20, 2026**, and must reference “Case No. 9884”.² Interventions are governed by *Annotated Code of Maryland*, Public Utilities Article (“PUA”) § 3-106. The Applicant is directed to cause a display advertisement to be published in a newspaper in general circulation within Baltimore, Harford and Howard Counties at least twice, in successive weeks, prior to **Monday, July 13, 2026**, to also advise persons who seek to intervene in this proceeding that petitions to intervene shall be filed with the Commission's Executive Secretary by close of business on **Monday, July 20, 2026**.

Additionally, the Applicant is encouraged to use any social media or other communication methods to advise residents/businesses of Baltimore, Harford, and Howard Counties of the date by which petitions to intervene must be submitted. The Applicant is directed to file a certificate of publication and postings with the Commission on or before the date of the intervention deadline. Further, if the Applicant has not done so at the time of the filing of its application with the Commission, the Applicant is directed to comply with all notice and service of copy requirements established under the Code of Maryland Regulations (“COMAR”) and the PUA and file a certificate of compliance with the notice and service of copy requirements on or before **Monday, July 20, 2026**.

Additionally, the Commission hereby requests that the Maryland Department of Natural Resources, Power Plant Research Program (“PPRP”) report by **Tuesday, August 4, 2026**, as to whether PPRP considers the application to be administratively complete in accordance with COMAR 20.79.01.06.

Upon receipt of the completeness recommendation, the Commission will further consider the procedural schedule in this matter.
